

Stewardship Conversion: A Theology of Stewardship

Stewardship as Theological Task and Pastoral Care

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Participants will:

- a. see stewardship as a theological task
- b. grow in the understanding for the need to teach stewardship
- c. see that stewardship is a spiritual matter for pastoral care
- d. view the Gospel as the key to solving our stewardship crisis
- E. commit to change a pragmatic view of stewardship to a practical theology/pastoral theology view

Stewardship must be taught, it will not happen by accident, it goes against our human nature: *"It is not easy to be religious in a culture that encourages individualism and materialism at the same time. Little children are by nature selfish, they want what they want. They must be taught to be generous and to think about the needs of others. But many parents do not do that. They don't have time. They are too busy getting stuff for themselves. Thus, the urchins grow up to be selfish and insensitive... [The Christian] message has been largely lost because it's not a moneymaker."* (Losing Our Religion, BillOReilly.com)

Christian Stewardship is the **free** and **joyous** activity of the child of God and God's family, the church, in managing all of life and life's recourses for God's purposes.

WHY STEWARDSHIP?

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Stewardship is a Theological Task

Stewardship is the THIRD ARTICLE RESPONSE (**We are sanctified!**) to the SECOND ARTICLE's redefinitions of who we are in relationship to God (**We are redeemed!**) using FIRST ARTICLE gifts (**He richly provides me with all that I need to support this body and life.**)

Haushalterschaft ist die ANTWORT DES DRITTEN ARTIKELS (**Wir sind geheiligt!**) Auf die Neudeinitionen des ZWEITEN ARTIKELS, wer wir in Beziehung zu Gott sind (**Wir sind erlöst**) durch die Verwendung der Geschenke des ERSTEN ARTIKELS (**Mit aller Notdurft und Nahrung des Leibes und Lebens mich reichlich und täglich versorget!**)

Stewardship is NOT a program

- No paint by numbers system will cause good stewardship in your congregation or even individuals in your congregation.

Stewardship is Taught

- Daily baptismal renewal
- A call to repentance (**The primary force of Stewardship**)
- Return to our Biblical and Confessional foundations
 - Faithful preaching and teaching
 - Proper distinction of Law and Gospel

All we do as faithful stewards flows from what we have been made in Christ.
